Animal magnetism, also known as mesmerism, was the name given by German doctor Franz Mesmer in the 18th century to what he believed to be an invisible natural force possessed by all living things, including humans, animals, and vegetables. He believed that the force could have physical effects, including healing. Very good in red cloth, spine gilt. Spine and boards stamped in black. John Milne Bramwell (1852-1925) was a Scottish physician, surgeon and specialist medical hypnotist. His father had seen James Esdaile (1808–1859) at work and, as a child, Bramwell had seen his father replicate Esdaile's mesmeric experiments. Very good- in green cloth. Spine gilt, title blind-stamped on front board. Contains previous owner's bookplate. Some toning of pages, but text is clean and bright. 12mo. 216pp. **\$30.**

Natural and Mesmeric Clairvoyance
By James Esdaile
Reprint of 1852 Edition

Esdaile, James. *Natural and Mesmeric Clairvoyance*. New York: Arno Press, 1975. Reprint of 1852 English Edition. Includes practical application of mesmerism in surgery and medicine. James Esdaile (1808–1859) was a Scottish surgeon, who served for twenty years with the East India Company. Esdaile is thought by many to have been a pioneer in the use of hypnosis for surgical anaesthesia in the era immediately prior to the discovery of chloroform. Near fine in red cloth, spine and front board gilt though faded. Interior clean and very bright. Octavo. 272pp. **\$12.**

Hypnotism, or Suggestion and Psychotherapy
By Dr. August Forel
Swiss Psychiatrist and Co-Founder of Neuron Theory

A study of the psychological, psycho-physiological, and therapeutic aspects of hypnotism. Translated from the Fifth German Edition by H. W. Armit. Auguste-Henri Forel (1848-1931) was a Swiss myrmecologist, neuroanatomist, and psychiatrist, notable for his investigations into the structure of the human brain. He is considered a co-founder of the neuron theory. Very good- in grey cloth, spine gilt with red leather label. Some foxing pages and pencil notes. In a protective mylar cover. By John Hartland and Stanley Tinkler

Wookey. Contains information about the history and theory of hypnosis, as well as clinical applications. Very good- in original purple wraps with protective wrapping. Spine sunned. Described by the editor as, “the first important discussion of hypnosis and suggestibility to be based upon results obtained by the scientific methods of modern experimental psychology.” Ad for the book pasted down on ffep. Discussion of the psychological effects of war, such as “shell-shock”, now known as posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Very good in original wraps with title information on front cover. Some sunning to edges of wraps. Interior clean and bright. Octavo. 112pp. **\$60.**

The Rationale of Mesmerism
By A. P. Sinnett
English Author and Theosophist

Sinnett, A. P. *The Rationale of Mesmerism*. Boston and New York: Houghton, Mifflin and Company, 1893. Alfred Percy Sinnett (1840–1921) was an English author and theosophist, who also wrote *Esoteric Buddhism*, *The Occult World*, and *Karma*. Very good+ in blue cloth, spine gilt. In a protective cover. Some toning of page edges, but text is clean and bright. 12mo. 232pp. **\$20.**

With a foreword by James. H. Leuba, Professor of Psychology at Bryn Mawr College. Edward D. Snyder was an Associate Professor of English at Haverford College. Dickens' *Great Expectations* is dedicated to Townshend. Very good- in brown cloth, spine gilt. Spine sunned. Illustrated. Foxing inside, but text is bright.
